SEVENTEENTH CENTURY GRAMMAR SCHOOL LIBRARY COLLECTIONS

In this Table four seventeenth century English grammar school library collections are compared with the list of books suggested by Charles Hoole in 1660 for inclusion in school libraries. In the first column are listed the "subsidiary books" which were to "be laid up in the Schoole-Library", using the rather vague bibliographic details given in Hoole's A New Discovery of the Old Art of Teaching Schoole.... In the second column, the works mentioned by Hoole are listed with further bibliographic details, as they were identified by E.T. Campagnac in his 1913 edition of Hoole's A New Discovery.... In columns three to six these works are noted when they are found in any of the four grammar school library collections -Hawkshead, Heskin, St. Albans, and Bristol - with the bibliographic details as given in the appropriate school library catalogue. At the end of the comparative Table, all the other books (that is, works not specifically recommended by Hoole), in each of these four catalogues, are listed.

A SURVEY OF LIBRARIES IN INDEPENDENT SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN QUEENSLAND 1978

Very little accessible published information existed on school libraries in independent schools in Queensland when I began my research in 1978. At that time I was aware that a library had been in existence at Townsville Grammar School from 1888, 1 and that some other independent schools had libraries which were older than this, though I had no further information about them. It was apparent that in order to collect reliable information on individual school libraries, I would need to visit the schools, work through any library records available, check through older library books which might have survived, read the "Library Notes" sections of the school magazines, and interview older staff members. Two days spent investigating such sources at the Townsville Grammar School convinced me that visits to a number of schools would yield a great deal of useful information both about those school libraries and about school library development generally. Because travel in Queensland can be difficult, time-consuming, and expensive, I needed to identify those schools which had older libraries, or archival collections of school records which might include library records, so that visits to the schools could be planned in detail some time ahead.

From lists prepared by the Guidance and Special Education Branch of the Queensland Department of Education, the Catholic Education
Offices in Townsville, Cairns, and Rockhampton, and the Association

of Independent Schools of Queensland, 1 and with the aid of the various Queensland telephone directories, a list of secondary independent schools was collated. Using this list as a mailing list, a brief questionnaire, with covering letter, was sent to ninety-seven schools. Of these schools, fifty-eight returned completed questionnaires. Since many of the schools which did not return questionnaires were of relatively recent foundation, little attempt was made to send follow up letters to those who did not respond. However where I had had previous professional contact with the principal or the librarian of an older school which did not respond to the questionnaire, I did follow it up by telephone. In the few other cases where an older school did not respond, I was able to collect some information on the history of the school library by other means than a visit.²

The information requested in the questionnaire was to be used only as a basis for planning visits to schools. I wanted to know the approximate date at which a library had been established in the school, and whether or not the school now had a "Commonwealth" library, that is, a new library, financed, at least partly, with the aid of Commonwealth Government funds, and meeting its standards. I asked about records of the school library which might be held within the school, so that I would have an idea of the amount of historical material available there. I also asked for details of any published

history of the school, because such information can be very difficult to locate, particularly when the histories are published privately or in pamphlet form. None of the major Queensland libraries has a large collection of school histories, and there is no comprehensive bibliography of them, 1 so that, unless notified of its existence by a school, an historian could remain unaware of a published school history.

I decided on the schools to be visited on the basis of the information given by the schools themselves about the age of their library and the library records available; a reading of the published school history if one was available; and with reference to comments made in response to Question Five, in which I asked permission to visit the school. In all, over the next twelve months, I visited some eighteen Queensland independent secondary school libraries. Where I did not visit a school which I knew to have an older library, I was often able to read issues of the school magazine in the John Oxley Memorial Library, in the local public library, or in the possession of former pupils.

For most of the schools I visited, I was the first person to have researched the early history of the school library. As a result, I found, in several schools, that the library had in fact been established earlier than the date given by the school. The second column of the following Table shows such discrepancies. They occurred sometimes because schools were genuinely unaware of early library provision; sometimes because schools were reluctant, in the

light of modern school library standards, to call a bookcase in the dining hall, or a few hundred books in a top corridor, a "library".

The independent schools in Townsville and Charters Towers were not included in this questionnaire survey, since I already had fairly detailed information about the library provision in each of them, having visited them several times to supervise Townsville College of Advanced Education students on practicum. By contacting the principals and school librarians, I was able to make arrangements to look at the relevant records at the Townsville Grammar School, St. Anne's School, Townsville (now the Cathedral School of St. Anne and St. James), St. Patrick's College, Townsville, All Souls' and St. Gabriel's School, Charters Towers, and Mount Carmel College, Charters Towers.

Though this questionnaire was used to collect information about the historical resources in the schools related to school library development, and as a basis for arranging visits to schools for detailed work with the library records, no attempt was made to do an historical survey of school libraries by questionnaire. In her thesis on Pennsylvania school libraries, Sister M. Constance Melvin¹ noted that she had trialled an historical survey questionnaire form with the incumbent librarians in a group of schools in Pennsylvania, and found it unreliable:

...these persons were unable to supply the needed information themselves, were sometimes unable to get reliable information from fellow teachers, tended to glorify with complete credit a former superintendent, and failed to supply information which was available elsewhere in published form. The idea of using the questionnaire was then abandoned. The difficulty of obtain-

ing information concerning some of the oldest school libraries by this method was verified in the results of a questionnaire that Maud Minster had sent out... 1

This conclusion is confirmed by my own experience with the dates given by school librarians for the establishment of their libraries.

On the following pages is a summary, in Table form, of the results of my survey and the visits, together with a copy of the letter and questionnaire sent to each school.




