

HOLIDAY SCIENCE HORRIBLES

Sustainability – planned management of a natural resource to prevent exploitation, pollution, destruction, or neglect and to ensure the future use of the resource.

Cephalopod – a group of molluscs whose name means "head-foot". They are found in all the oceans of the world and octopus, squid and cuttlefish are among the 786 living species. Their muscular foot is modified into arms or tentacles. They move by jet propulsion and have a very well developed nervous system.

Echinoderm – a group of marine animals found in the ocean. There are about 7,000 living species including sea stars, sea urchins, sand dollars, sea cucumbers and brittle stars. They all have fivefold radial symmetry at some stage in their lifespan and they have a calcified exoskeleton. They have no brain, reproduce sexually and many have the ability to regenerate.

Symbiosis – when two organisms live together. Their association might be mutually beneficial - for example the clownfish and sea anemone; or it might be parasitic where one animal feeds off another causing the second animal to become sick or die.

Photosynthesis – a cellular process where plants make their food. Green plants and other organisms like algae use energy from the sun to make food from carbon dioxide and water.

Hermaphrodite – an organism that possess both male and female sexual organs during their lives. Some organisms
