

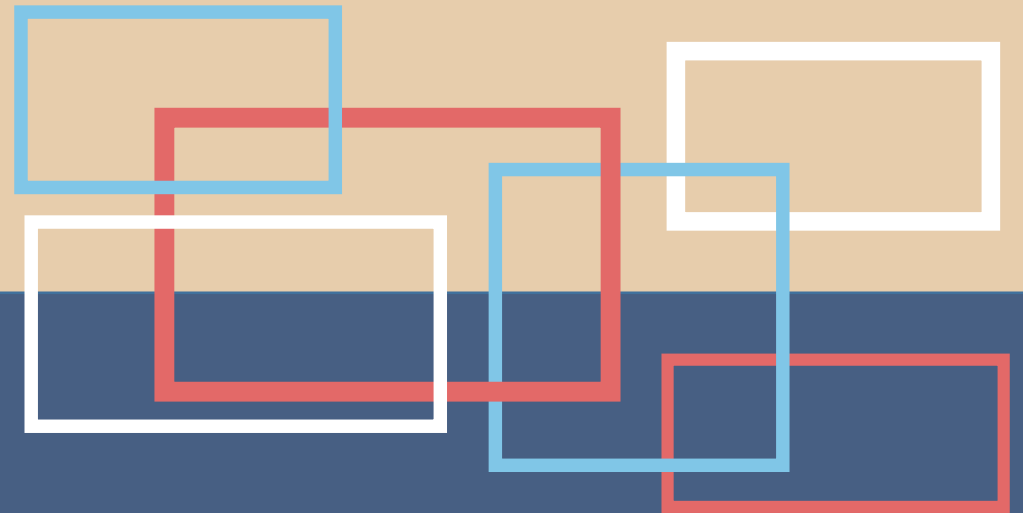
## Special Thanks
